



Ivy Scarfette or Garland

This fun little motif is addictive and easy, it's just a few stitches, a flipping of your work, then repeating as long as you wish! I like it as a decorative leafy garland, soft and beautiful. If you wish to use it as a scarfette, make a 10 foot length and join your ends to make a huge loop that you'll coil up and cozy into. It can even be worked in thread crochet, as you can see in the bottom example in the photo at left, and will make a tighter and smaller garland.

For this garland, you'll want a medium weight yarn and a size G hook, or, for a more delicate edging (see light colored ivy on bottom right of photo), fashion crochet thread (no. 10) and a size 4 steel hook.

Instructions:

Ch 1, tighten to form a knot. Ch 2, join to 2nd ch from hook to form a small ring, then make a leaf in that ring:

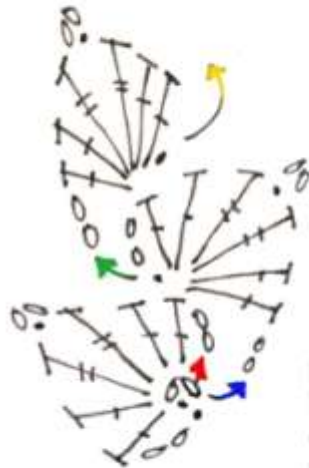
*ch 2, work (2 dc, tc, ch 2, join to top of last tc to form a "picot" or tip for the leaf, tc, 2 dc) all in ring, sl st in ring, (see photo on next page).



*ch 2, turn (that is, flip your work so you're looking at the back side), work (2 dc, tc, ch 2, join to top of last tc for picot, tc, 2 dc,) all in top of last dc of prev leaf worked, ch 2, join to same sp, repeat from * to desired length.

- X single crochet
- T double crochet

red arrow indicates beginning of first leaf;
blue arrow indicates beginning
of second leaf; green arrow begins
the third leaf, yellow the fourth
